Be Open-Minded and Respectful of New Ideas and Experiences

This year will, no doubt, be different than years in the past. I ask you to be open-minded about any changes that happen. Please trust that I have the band and your best interest at heart. I want to take the marching band's successes to a new level.

I have an open-door policy. If you are ever unhappy about a situation or the way things are going, please come and talk to me personally. Do not let things fester and do not take out your anger or frustration out on the field. I am more than happy to take suggestions and ideas because this is your band, and I want this to be a great year!

Be On Time

"To be early is to be on time, to be on time is to be late, and to be late is to be forgotten." —Dr. William D. Revelli

Be Prepared

Always come to band with your music, flip folder, lyre, **PENCIL**, coordinate sheet/name tag/lanyard, instrument, and supplies (valve oil, cork grease, etc.). You will be marking your music and **A PENCIL IS NECESSARY**. If we are outside, make sure to have water, sunscreen, athletic shoes and clothing, and other necessary items.

Maintenance of the Band Facilities

The band room, locker room, practice rooms, hallways, auditorium, uniform room, dressing rooms and football field are our home for at least six months of the year. Leaving the band facilities messy and dirty is not acceptable. The best learning environment for our group is one that will be a clean music setting. Picking up papers, chairs, stands, music, reeds, garbage, etc. will be required of everyone. If we all pitch in, this will be any easy task.

Marching Band Uniforms and Your Behavior in these Uniforms

Full "winter" uniform parts include: blue/white jacket, black overall pants, hat, blue/white plume, black shoes, black FMB socks, black gloves, and white spats. Summer uniform parts include: blue FMB hat, blue FMB polo shirt, black shorts, black FMB socks, and black shoes. Take care of these uniforms. **You are required to keep all parts of your uniform clean**. While you are in a Rochester HS Falcon Marching Band uniform, you represent not only yourself and the FMB, but you also represent the entire band program, the school, the community, and the district. The proper attitude, behavior, and demeanor need to be adhered to at all times. At no time should a member of the Rochester HS Falcon Marching Band be rude or inconsiderate, vulgar, childish, immature, or any other negative stereotype. Our band is a high caliber ensemble and so are our standards for our students.

Instrument Equipment

It is the responsibility of the student to maintain the instruments that they use that belong to the school. Maintenance of the instruments will include oiled slides, oiled valves, periodic cleaning of instruments and general care of instruments. Only students assigned to these instruments may use them. This goes for all woodwind, brass, and percussion instruments and color guard equipment.

Students will use their personal instruments in a professional way. They will not allow other students to use their instruments and they will only use their instruments in a musical way. Loud blaring, blasting, and other non-musical sounds will not be tolerated and should not be encouraged.

Rehearsal Procedures

Proper use of rehearsals for band is a necessity. Rehearsals need to be conducted in a mature way. The directors and instructors have many informative things to say, and the ensemble should show respect by listening. When a director is on the podium, all ears and eyes need to focus to the front. Marching band rehearsals will be one of the following:

- 1) Indoor music rehearsal set up like a concert band rehearsal
- 2) Outdoor music rehearsal
- 3) Outdoor marching fundamentals the attention should be focused on a director for instruction and demonstration.
- 4) Outdoor marching rehearsal Each person will have his or her own coordinate sheet and is responsible for them for the ENTIRE season.

Extra Marching Band Rehearsals and/or Sectionals Attendance Policy

Only the directors may call extra rehearsals. Instructors, section leaders or drum majors may call sectionals. Each section will have at least 1 sectional per week during marching band season (usually 1 hour before weekly evening rehearsals). Directors may call full band rehearsals or sectionals, if necessary. A sufficient amount of time must be given to allow members of the individual sections and/or ensemble time to arrange their schedules to attend. That time will be set by the directors and agreed upon with the students.

Regularly Scheduled Daily Band Attendance Policy – Responsibility for Attendance

Attendance at rehearsals and performances are required for membership in the band program. Absences are permitted in the event of extenuating circumstances (i.e. personal illness, death in the family). Excessive absences, even for these reasons, will cause severe problems and may result in loss of position or rank within the organization. <u>All necessary absences should be presented in</u> <u>writing in advance, if possible.</u> Failure to appear at a scheduled rehearsal or performance without proper notice in advance may result in suspension from the group or a low or failing grade for that period. It is impossible to "make up a performance" and the other members must carry an extra burden because of someone else's inconsideration. Extenuating circumstances should be discussed with the director prior to the event. Performance dates are given well in advance and plans should be made around them.

Hazing and Harassment Policy

The Rochester HS Falcon Marching Band defines hazing as any action taken or situation created which is intentionally designed to produce mental or physical discomfort, embarrassment, harassment, or ridicule. Such activities and situations include: creation of excessive fatigue: physical or psychological abuse; wearing apparel which is conspicuous and not normally in good taste; engaging in public stunts; morally degrading or humiliating games and activities; late work sessions which interfere with scholastic activities; and any other activities which are not consistent with the policies of the Rochester Community Schools. Any band members in violation of the Hazing and Harassment Policy will be immediately referred to the Rochester High School Administration.

Hydration Policy

Members of the Rochester HS Falcon Marching Band will take water breaks at least once every 90 minutes. Water breaks will be given more frequently depending upon temperature and intensity of physical activity. Water will be available at all times. All student are <u>required</u> to drink water or a sports drink during water breaks. We will also have at least one large water jug available for student use. A band member may excuse him or herself from a practice or performance at any time if they feel lightheaded, dizzy, weak, nauseated, or have muscle cramps. The student should then report directly to a chaperone or one of the directors or instructors..


